

In-Transit Permits

You can move an unregistered vehicle or trailer from one location to another inside Alberta, or to another Province within Canada. The start or end destination point **MUST** be a location in Alberta.

A permit can be issued for the following reasons and lengths of time when you provide valid insurance and the vehicle details (Model, Year, Make, VIN #):

1. Move from point A to point B. – Maximum of 7 days
2. Towed Vehicles – Maximum of 7 days
3. Demonstration/Test Drive Purposes – Maximum of 7 days
4. Repairs/Servicing – Maximum of 7 days
5. Salvage vehicles – Maximum of 24 hours

NOTE:

A client may use their valid licence plate/registration from an existing vehicle to another vehicle for up to a maximum of 14 days from the date on the ownership document(s), e.g. bill of sale, within the Province of Alberta. After the 14 days, the client **must** transfer the licence plate/registration to the new vehicle or apply for a new licence plate/registration at an Alberta Registry.

The 14 day grace period for the transferring of licence plates **does not** apply if the vehicle is a commercial vehicle used for the transportation of goods or passengers for compensation.

The 14 day grace period allowed for the transferring of licence plate/registration **does not** apply to insurance documents. A client **must** provide proof of valid insurance for the vehicle being registered.

Load Licensing Permit

When an unregistered vehicle or trailer is carrying a load, a Load Licensing Permit is required **in addition to** the In-transit Permit.
